## Fishermen Spend Millions On Sport In United States

It has been estimated by the commerce departments, bureau of fisheries, that more than 115 million dollars was spent by sports fishermen of the United States during 1934.

In other words, every sports fisherman in the United States spent on an average of \$12.14 for licenses, tackle, transportation and guides, boat hire, live bait, boots, oil, hotel accommodations and lodgings. Approximately 31 cents of this was spent for tackle, rods, lures, reels, flies, plugs, spinners, landing nets, and other equipment.

The year 1934 furnished two record making bouts in one of which Jimmy McLarnin lost his welterweight crown to Barney Ross and in the other the Vancouver Irishman regained his title. The victory by Ross enabled the Chicago youth to attain fame as the first modern gladiator to be the holder of two championships, the lightweight and welterweight, at one time.
