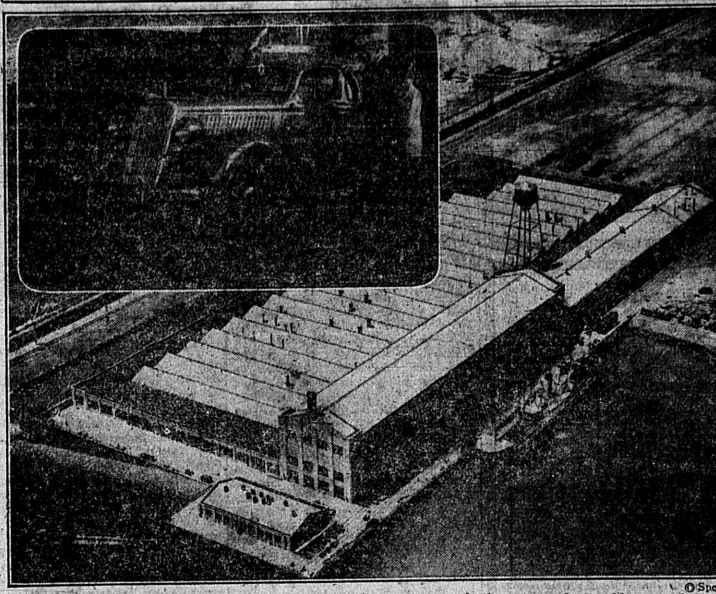

FORD LONG BEACH PLANT OPENS



The great Ford plant at Long Beach, employing over 1700 people, has resumed assembly operations and is now turning out more than 120 cars and trucks a day. Inset shows Mayor Carl Fletcher of Long Beach driving one of the completed cars off the assembly line the first day of the open-house week, as Ira B. Groves, Ford branch manager, points the way.

Directly benefiting the entire Southwest, the Long Beach plant of the Ford Motor Company is again in active operation.

Employment has been given to more than 1700 people whose wages alone will amount to nearly \$2,000,000 annually. In addition, millions more will be spent for tires, batteries, and other supplies, with local manufacturers, whose employs will in turn profit from greater business. The increased

purchasing power of workers in this area will have a stimulating effect on business of every kind.

Ford cars and trucks sold in Southern California and Arizona are now assembled at the Long Beach plant by workers who are paid a minimum \$5 daily wage and work an average of 40 hours a week. Every car assembled means an average of 65 hours employment for a plant worker.

During the open-house week, visitors numbered close to 2,000 daily.

Many high school and Junior College students were taken in groups by their instructors to see the modern precision machinery and production system of the plant.

So great has been the public's interest in seeing the plant that the management has decided to continue to welcome visitors at regular visiting hours, ten o'clock, one o'clock, and two o'clock any working day, at which hours guides will be present to conduct parties through the plant.

MISSION Play Reopening Is Planned

Definite plans are now under way to re-open the Mission Play, John Steven McGoarty's historical romance of old California days, which has been closed for the past three years.

E. K. Hoak, former president, treasurer and general manager, has consented to direct the campaign to bring this wonderful play back to the public notice.
