## Bible Revival Services Sunday

The world's largest Bible map and great revelation of Jesus in a proposed national evening Bible revival, will be presented by Explorer A. F. Futterer, of Los Angeles, at the Torrance Christian church next Sunday evening, March 10, beginning at 7:30 o'clock. He will first give a brief outline of his youthful experiences on the Australian gold-fields in 1887. It was through a critical illness that Mr. Futterer here began his life's work in Biblical research, which led him into most parts of the world, including Palestine where he spent two years searching for that sacred relic, the Golden Ark of the Covenant.

He brought back a vast collection of Holyland relics and souvenirs, several of which he will put on exhibit next Sunday evening. He plans to return to Jerusalem in the near future to build a research institute. His wife will land there on March 11 to select a suitable building location.  
At the present time Mr. Futterer is planning a five-year Messianic Bible revival in America. The service should be interesting to all Bible students and others. The offering to be taken will be sent direct to Jerusalem headquarters for Biblical work.

## Details On Outfall Sewer To Be Settled

Directors of Sanitation District Will Meet Next Week

Mayor Scott R. Ludlow of Torrance and the mayors of the several other cities that are served by the county sanitation districts will authorize final details in negotiating the agreement for the \$872,000 grant from the PWA to construct the White Point outfall sewer at the directors' regular meetings on March 12 and 13, it was stated today.

At that time, the directors will authorize Chairman H. C. Legg of the board of supervisors and Secretary A. S. Soule of the county sanitation districts to sign the formal agreement, negotiated through the highly successful efforts of A. K. Warren, chief engineer of the districts.

Whether plans and specifications can be made ready for presentation to the directors at this month's regular meeting is problematical, Warren said today. They now are being rushed to completion, however, by engineers at the districts' offices in the Law building, Los Angeles.  
The district will accept the full amount of the PWA grant, which is \$82,000 more than asked for, Warren said. The districts, through Chief Engineer Warren, had carried on negotiations direct with Washington. Officials of a grant of but \$340,000. After official promises had been given Warren, the grant came through for \$872,000.
