New Law to Protect State Asset

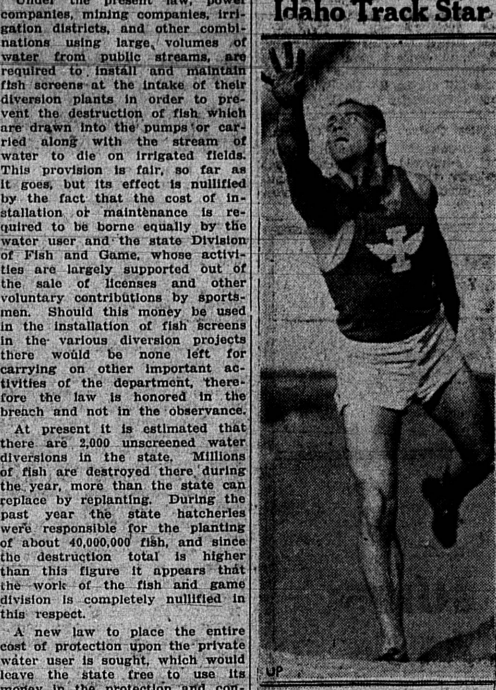
Advocated By Fish and Game Dept.

Fishermen, who are interested in conservation of this natural resource, are urged by the Fish and Game Development Association, to support Assembly Bill No. 1027, now before the state legislature, which if passed will repeal the existing law in relation to the installation or maintenance of fish screens.

Under the present law, power companies, mining companies, irrigation districts, and other combinations using large volumes of water from public streams, are required to install and maintain fish screens at the intake of their diversion plants in order to prevent the destruction of fish which are drawn into the pumps or carried along with the stream of water to die on irrigated fields. This provision is fair, so far as it goes, but its effect is nullified by the fact that the cost of installation or maintenance is required to be borne equally by the water user and the state Division of Fish and Game, whose activities are largely supported out of the sale of licenses and other voluntary contributions by sportsmen. Should this money be used in the installation of fish screens in the various diversion projects there would be none left for carrying on other important activities of the department, therefore the law is honored in the breach and not in the observance.

At present it is estimated that there are 2,000 unscreened water diversions in the state. Millions of fish are destroyed there during the year, more than the state can replace by replanting. During the past year the state hatcheries were responsible for the planting of about 40,000,000 fish, and since the destruction total is higher than this figure it appears that the work of the fish and game division is completely nullified in this respect.

A new law to place the entire cost of protection upon the private water user is sought, which would leave the state free to use its money in the protection and conservation of this asset.

A new team of mules can be bought for \$250, the superintendent of the fruit experiment station where the two were employed pointed out, and Maude and Jack need a rest.
