

### Miss Stanwyck Gets Seasick On Dry Land

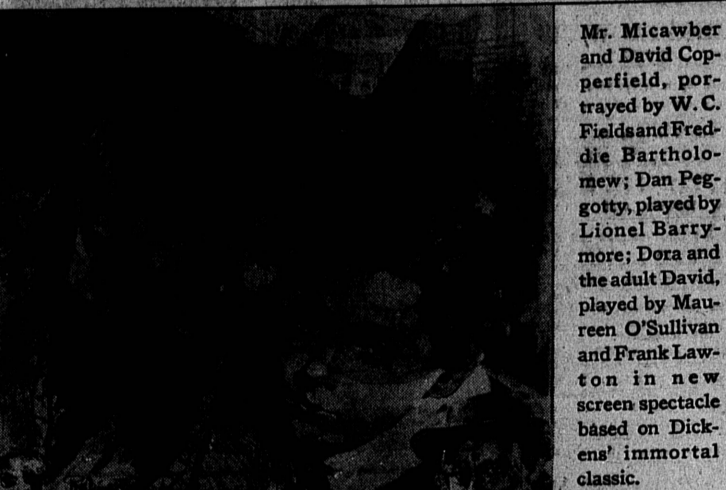

But she went 25 miles from the ocean, to the First National studios in North Hollywood, to get a case of real sea sickness. The sickness developed in the production of the picture, "The Woman In Red," which comes to the Torrance Theatre Wednesday only, March 27. In one sequence Barbara appears on a yacht off Long Island. The scene calls for quite a swell on the ocean, as one girl falls overboard and is drowned. Most of the shots were taken on the Pacific at Santa Monica, but close-ups were made in the studio on an improvised yacht built on rollers so that it would toss like a real yacht. It was while working on the dry land yacht that Barbara developed sea sickness. She had worked on the boat most of the day. Finally towards evening she staggered off to her dressing room. First aid was called and the doctor reported she had a genuine and very bad case of sea sickness. She was sent home for rest for two days.

Mr. King and Miss Murray are professionals of long experience. They have appeared in many New York shows and have spent a number of years touring the important vaudeville circuits

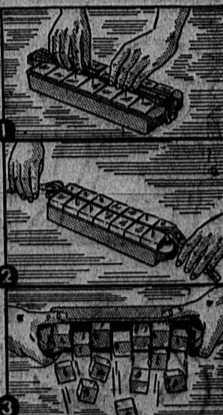
throughout the country, so that their knowledge of professional requirements is based on actual work in the business.

**WISTARIA FETE at Sierra Madre IN PROGRESS**  
Sierra Madre's annual wistaria blossom fete, held each spring when the famous wistaria vine is in full bloom, is now in progress and will continue until March 31. The grounds are open daily, luncheons and teas served to visitors who seek refreshment. The world-famous wistaria vine was planted in the spring of 1893 by Mrs. W. F. Brugman, then owner of what is now the estate of Mr. Estelle H. Fennel. Henry T. Fennel purchased the property in 1913, and at once saw the possibilities of the vine and began an intensive cultivation. It is now believed to be the largest vine in the world. It encircles the dwelling and extends in every direction on pergolas, wires and trees, to a distance of 200 feet from the root. The first fete was held in 1916, and since that time has been an annual event, attracting half a million visitors from all parts of the world.
