Collections of unsecured personal property taxes, due and payable when that type of property is assessed, are nearly 40 percent ahead of last year, County Assessor Ed Hopkins reported today.

Collections to the end of March were \$121,456, which represented a short month, since the assessor started his work officially on March 4, the first Monday, as provided for by law.
