### For Lenten Meals

Fish salads and fish sandwich spreads combined with mayonnaise are delicious! Many housewives keep a jar of mayonnaise in the refrigerator, ready to prepare a salad, a canape or sandwiches at a moment's notice. Here are a few suggestions:

#### Salmon Mold Salad

½ tsp. gelatin  
2 cup cold water  
1-3 cup lemon juice  
1 large can salmon (2 cups when flaked)  
1 cup mayonnaise, bought or home-made  
1 cup chopped celery  
1¼ cups chopped green pepper  
1 tsp. chopped onion  
Salt, pepper

Soak the gelatin in cold water and dissolve it in a double boiler. Add the lemon juice. Let this mixture cool. When it is cold, mix lightly with other ingredients and season as desired. Pour mixture into a fish mold. When it is firm, unmold on a platter, garnish with small lettuce leaves with dabs of mayonnaise on them.

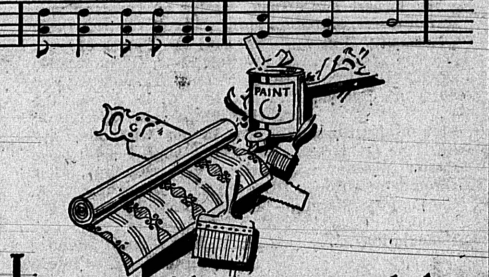
#### Sandwich Spread

Make a workable paste using mayonnaise (as a binder) with any boned, left-over or packaged fish (salmon, sardine, tuna, cod, etc.). Season with salt, pepper, paprika and onion juice.

#### Crabmeat in Peppers

Make a salad of canned crabmeat, broken up or flaked, chopped celery, mayonnaise, and seasonings according to taste. Cut two-inch slices from the whole green peppers, remove seeds and pith and place each on a crisp lettuce leaf. Fill with the crabmeat salad and garnish with little pieces of pimiento.

### Local Doctors Resent Ruling of County Medical Association

Local medical doctors this week expressed their righteous indignation of an autocratic attempt on the part of "big town" doctors to prohibit them from publishing professional cards in their local newspapers, lodge directories, church papers and similar publications. A resolution adopted recently by the board of councilors of the Los Angeles County Medical Association branded such practice as "unethical" and ruled that "when evidence is produced showing disregard of the resolution, the offender be cited to appear before the council of the Los Angeles County Medical Association for censure or suspension."

That the attempt on the part of "big shots" in the medical profession to dictate the affairs of members in the suburban areas is resented was aptly illustrated by the curt remark made by a prominent Torrance physician who said, "As far as I am concerned they can take their association and go to hell."

As regards the question of advertising, local doctors can see no difference between publishing a professional card in the local newspaper or church program and in painting the same data on an office door or a sign in front of a residence or office.

Medical men, particularly in smaller communities, are among the most public spirited and charitably-minded citizens, and the practice of running professional cards permits them to support many worthwhile civic institutions in a dignified and ethical manner.

Paradoxically, the official magazine, "The Bulletin," of the Los Angeles County Medical Association, which contained the resolution prohibiting professional cards, itself was made up largely of advertising, including several good sized "professional cards" of "specialist" members of the association in Los Angeles.

### Rotary Program Features Stage and Radio Stars

A highly interesting program of songs and dances provided a delightful innovation at the Torrance Rotary Club luncheon this noon. The program was arranged by Mme. Teala Billini, club pianist, and a number of the wives of Rotarians attended.

Robert Leigh, star of the New York stage success, "Blossom Time," "Student Prince" and "Buddy," sang two groups of songs. Mr. Leigh has an unusually pleasing tenor voice and his selections were generously applauded. He is frequently heard over the New York studio of the National Broadcasting Company and has given a number of concerts in Aeolian Hall and other music centers in the metropolis.

Celeste Murray, Marvin Jensen and Donald Adams, all professional song and dance artists trained in the Dave King-Mae Murray Studios, contributed several numbers which were enjoyed. Mr. King and Miss Murray also did a soft shoe dance, which drew enthusiastic applause. Mme. Billini accompanied the artists at the piano.
