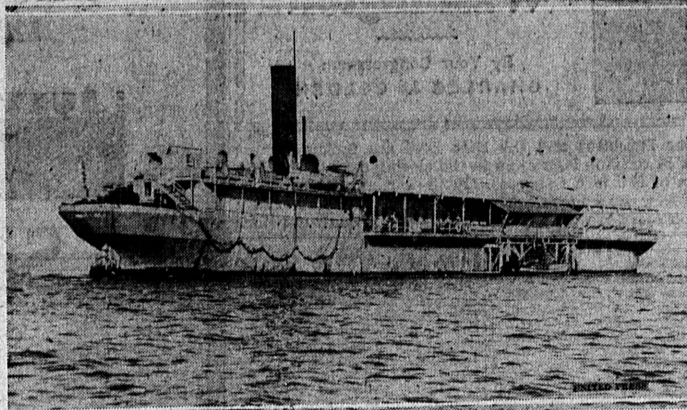

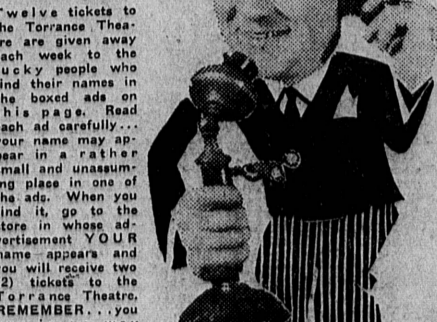

than Los Angeles are Long Beach second with \$122,920,400; Pasadena \$78,099,925; Glendale \$50,751,015; Beverly Hills, \$49,479,655; Santa Monica \$39,239,110; Vernon \$31,792,745; Alhambra \$20,018,470; Burbank \$17,601,900; Culver City \$10,405,110; El Segundo \$10,501,305; Huntington Park \$14,760,210; Inglewood \$11,289,305; Pomona \$11,266,310; San Marino \$18,457,055; Signal Hill \$27,237,640; and South Gate \$10,779,490.

According to these figures Torrance ranks eleventh among the 44 municipalities of the county, exceeded among the smaller communities only by Signal Hill with its wealth of oil properties, Alhambra and Burbank.

Los Angeles county will have approximately \$230,000,000 of additional taxable property upon which to levy this year, it was revealed this week with the report of County Assessor Ed Hopkins to the board of supervisors. Of this sum, \$200,000,000 is the assessor's estimate of the value of public utilities, which are to be included in the county's tax roll this year for the first time since 1910.

Real estate values showed a decrease of more than \$1,000,000 while improvements showed a gain of \$21,142,700 for the county as a whole. Personal property also showed a gain of \$8,486,500.

Real estate in the city of Los Angeles decreased \$11,375,325 in value for taxation purposes while stocks and bonds in the city were valued at \$11,923,855 less. In the county as a whole, stocks and bonds increased \$515,490 in value, the report shows.

Total real estate value in the county is \$1,078,828,245 this year as against \$1,079,917,065 last year. Both these figures are minus exemptions but while the figure for last year is after equalization, that for this year is before equalization.

Improvements, where the largest gain is recorded, totaled \$744,882,595 this year against \$726,739,895 for 1934. Personal property this year is valued at \$288,403,280 as against \$279,916,760 last year, a gain of \$8,486,500.

Solvent credits, or accounts owed to persons residing in this county, are valued at \$285,989,945, or \$16,377,115 more than last year. Stocks and bonds and solvent credits are listed as "intangibles" and are not included in the amount against which general county taxes are levied.

ST. LOUIS, (U.P.)—St. Louis is fast losing many of its old landmarks—mansions, which are being razed to save taxes. Vandeventer Place has given up two—one constructed by the late John D. Perry, banker and railroad president, in 1880. The other was owned by Hugh A. Donnelly.
