ORDINANCE NO. 267
ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE ESTABLISHING A FREE MUNICIPAL LIBRARY.
WHEREAS, on August 14, 1935, the City of Torrance, a municipal corporation, withdrew from the Los Angeles County, California, free library system, and has notified the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County, California, that said City no longer desires to be a part of said system, all as required by law, and WHEREAS, said City of Torrance is desirous of establishing a free, municipal library for said City of Torrance in accordance with the provisions of Act 2745, during the Session of the State of California, Stat. 1901, p. 557, now, therefore, be it

ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Torrance, as follows:
Section 1. That a free library be and the same is hereby established for said City of Torrance, California, a municipal corporation, in accordance with the provisions of said Act and that said library shall be forever free to the inhabitants and non-resident taxpayers of said City, subject always to the rules, regulations and by-laws which may be established by the Board of Library Trustees and subject to the provisions of said Act, as amended.

Section 2. That this ordinance, when effective immediately, shall have the effect of preserving the public peace, health and/or safety demanding it. The facts constituting such urgency are as follows: "That the City of Torrance withdraw from the Los Angeles County, California, free public library system on August 14, 1935. This ordinance, when effective, will establish a free public library for the City of Torrance. In order to pay the expense of operation of said free public library, it will be necessary to establish a tax rate for the fiscal year 1935-36, on all taxable property in the City of Torrance. Such tax rate cannot be established as herein provided, and must be established not later than August 31, 1935, as the County of Los Angeles, California, collects all taxes for the City of Torrance and has demanded of said City that such tax rate and all other tax rates be established by said date and that said County be informed thereof by that time. If said tax rate is not established by the aforesaid date, said public library for the City of Torrance cannot be opened for one year from July 1, 1935, as there will be no means of operating the same. The failure to open said library for one year will jeopardize the preservation of the public peace, health and safety.

Section 3. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this ordinance by said City Council, and shall cause the same to be published by one insertion in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Torrance, and thereupon and thereafter the same shall be in full force and effect. Passed and adopted by the City Council of the City of Torrance, signed and approved by the Mayor of said City, and attested by the City Clerk of said City, this 20th day of August, 1935. ORDINANCE NO. 235-A
ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE REPEALING A PORTION OF PARAGRAPH 70, SECTION 12, ORDINANCE 235.
The City Council of the City of Torrance does hereby ordain as follows: That the following portion of Paragraph 70, Section 12, of Ordinance 235 of the City of Torrance be and the same is hereby repealed, to-wit: "That for the business of plumbing, contracting, general contracting, and electric wiring contracting, no license shall be issued hereunder until a bond in the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) approved by the City Council shall have been filed with the City Clerk, which bond shall be conditioned upon the performance by the licensee of all work on buildings in the City of Torrance in accordance with the ordinances of the City of Torrance and the laws of the State of California and which bonds shall be executed by a reputable bonding company as surety thereon."
