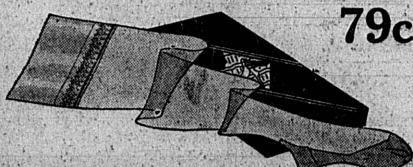

Work Relief Job Is Not Intended To Be Permanent

Those Who Refuse Conditions Will Be Dropped From Rolls

SAN FRANCISCO—President Roosevelt's order dropping from the relief rolls all persons refusing to accept wages and conditions of employment provided by the new federal works program will be followed literally in California.

This was made clear today by Works Progress Administrator Frank M. McLaughlin, who said the order would apply to all persons refusing WPA work assignments for any reason whatsoever.

"The work program was devised in order that the federal government might quit the business of relief," said McLaughlin. "It is designed to provide employment for destitute, able-bodied persons only until such time as need for it shall have ceased."

Not Permanent Jobs Any misapprehension that the program is in any way competitive with private industry must be dispelled immediately, the administrator said.

The relief clients will be offered work opportunities by means of useful public projects and at monthly salaries which purposely have been made lower than those paid for similar employment in private industry. The plan is to provide the able-bodied unemployed with jobs permitting support of themselves and their families only until they can find jobs for themselves.

The free public employment services with which all relief clients must be registered if they are to be employed by the WPA will help clients to re-establish themselves in private jobs.

Taken Off Relief "The Works Progress Administration must assume that persons on relief who are not willing to work for wages and under conditions provided by the program have been improperly certified for relief as employable. Persons taking this attitude will be separated from the relief rolls, since the government only will aid those who are able and willing to work."

City School Board Proposes New Bond Issue to Construct Schools

Taxpayers in the Los Angeles city school district will be asked shortly to express themselves on a proposed \$12,393,000 bond issue, in order that the district may construct new schools at approximately one-half the regular cost, under the federal public works program. Torrance and Lomita are served by the district.

A formal resolution authorizing the calling of the election was being prepared today at the offices of the board of education in Los Angeles, with indications that the five board members would act upon it some time this week.

Taking advantage of federal grants would mean the school district, which takes in considerable territory outside the city of Los Angeles proper, would pay but 45 percent of the cost of the buildings, the government providing the other 45 percent under the president's \$1,386,000,000 public works program now getting under way. Also, interest on the \$12,393,000 bonds would be but 3 percent, it was stated.

Allocation of the federal government would be \$10,123,000, it was explained by Frank A. Bouelle, superintendent of schools.

The reconstruction program now being concluded in the Los Angeles district takes care of only the strictly emergency needs of the schools and completes only one-third of the work made necessary because of the earthquake damage and because of new and more stringent building requirements recently made mandatory by the state law, Bouelle added. "This additional reconstruction work is urgently needed and a wonderful opportunity is accorded local taxpayers to shift 45 percent of the cost to the federal government through favorable action on the proposed bond election."

TRUCK OVERTURNS

A truck loaded with rock and gravel went out of control on Via Mirlo, Palos Verdes Estates, Monday evening, and rolled backwards downhill. It overturned on striking a bank. The driver, E. A. Larson, of El Monte, was uninjured. The truck was owned by the Consolidated Rock Products.

Aquaplane Riders Will Emulate Flying Fish of Catalina Channel

Aquaplane riding as a competitive sport will be taken from the lakes and bays of California and given its first sea-going test September 7. The spectacular Aquaplane race from Catalina Island to the Hermosa-Manhattan Beach strand will be run on that date as a feature of the eight annual two-day Water Sports Regatta.

The race is under the auspices of the Junior Chamber of Commerce with Logan R. Cotton as general chairman.

A great \$500 "twin trophy" will be awarded the winners. One for the driver of the speedboat and one for the daring rider. A second place trophy, similar in design but smaller will go to the second place contestants. While place trophies will be awarded in third, fourth and fifth places. Medals will go to the mechanics—the unnamed heroes of the crossing, as well as to all participants crossing the finish line at Hermosa Beach, according to Cotton.

The course will lead the roaring boats and their skipping boards from Avalon towards the Palos Verdes. Hence to the Manhattan Beach Harbor for a big swing and a mile and a quarter straight-away to the finish.

The race will be run under the American Power Boat Association rules and is open to all amateur teams fulfilling the requirements, declares D. M. Callis, chairman of the race technical committee.

Restrictions barring sedan type and cruiser craft from the race were made in order to place all competing teams on an equal basis in navigating the grueling cross channel grind.

Around the Council Table

An appropriation of \$70 for painting the new pergola at the municipal park was made by the Torrance city council Tuesday evening.

A request to establish an auto wrecking yard on Border avenue near Dunreith, was denied, following the reading of vigorous protests from owners of property in the vicinity.

On recommendation of the Chamber of Commerce, the city approved an appropriation of \$200 for the Pageant of Progress and \$125 for the Torrance Bluebirds ball team. Chamber directors recommended that the \$200 appropriation for the Pageant of Progress be made on the condition that the committee in charge of the celebration raise \$800 from other sources.

Deeds for 27 pieces of property in connection with the widening of Hawthorne boulevard south of Sepulveda were accepted. City Engineer Leonard stated that this completed the necessary frontage required for the widening of Hawthorne avenue with the exception of one section owned by some 20 different parties and held in trust, and another small piece which would be condemned. The trust company is favorable to the project, Leonard explained, and that as soon as the various interests could be contacted, it was expected that deeds would be forthcoming.

On request of Frank Perkins, general chairman of the Pageant of Progress, the city council agreed to donate the lights at the municipal park during the celebration. Perkins also asked for the loan of city trucks to assist in hauling supplies and building materials to erect the various concessions, but no action on this request was taken by the council.

Adjournment was taken until Friday, August 23, at 5 p. m., when ordinances calling the special bond election are scheduled to be passed.

Mail Orders For Fair Scrip Now Being Accepted

Visitors May Purchase Books At Half the Regular Admission Price

Visitors who are planning to come on any of the ten days of the California State Fair which opens in Sacramento on August 21 can do their half-price ticket shopping by mail this year.

During the fair, the regular 50-cent admission will be charged for the principal attractions, but in advance of the opening, scrip books will be sold which contain the equivalent of ten admissions for 25 cents each.

Visitors who do not have access to the Futura Farmers, F. H. Clubs or metropolitan department stores which are adding in the advance sale can secure their half-price tickets by writing directly to the scrip department at the state fair grounds in Sacramento.

The privilege of purchasing half-price admissions will be withdrawn throughout the state on Friday, August 30, but will be continued at the state fair gates through the opening day, Saturday, August 31, only.

The scrip tickets are good for admission to the grounds, grandstand, horse show and parking areas and are also transferable.

Powder Magazine Permit Requested

Permission to establish a powder magazine for the storage of explosives to be used in cutting the tunnel through the Palos Verdes Hills for the White Point Outfall sewer was requested of the board of supervisors this week.

Application was made by Chief Engineer A. K. Warren, on behalf of the contractor, Shofner and Gordon, and the Hinman Brothers Construction Company.

Not more than 20,000 pounds would be stored at any time, Warren stated.
