oons sugar and cream well.



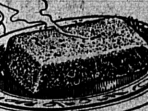
QUICK DESSERT

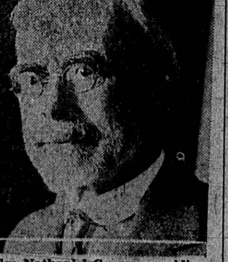
Young Corbett III, former welter-
