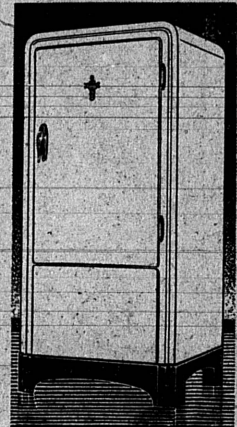

Historic Round-the-World Telephone Has Been Given to National Museum



Dr. Charles G. Abbot, secretary of the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D. C., signs a formal receipt for the telephone over which President Walter S. Gifford of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company talked around the world on April 25, 1935, and which has been presented to the Washington museum. Among the interested observers is Mrs. Elsie Bell Grosvenor, daughter of Alexander Graham Bell, inventor of the telephone.

Immediately after the around-the-world telephone conversation between President Walter S. Gifford, of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company, and Theodore G. Miller, Vice President in charge of that company's Long Lines Department, which took place on April 25, 1935, the Smithsonian Institution asked Mr. Gifford to give the telephone instrument he used on this occasion to the U. S. National Museum in Washington. Mr. Gifford consented, and the presentation took place on May 16. Very appropriately, Mrs. Elsie May Bell Grosvenor, daughter of Alexander Graham Bell, inventor of the telephone, and Dr. Gilbert Grosvenor, President of the National Geographic Society, were present in the Regents' Room of the Smithsonian Institution for the occasion, as also were Dr. Charles G. Abbot, Secretary of the Institution, Dr.

Alexander Wetmore, Assistant Secretary, and others of the scientific staff. In accepting the instrument, Dr. Abbot said that he was interested to note that the whole miraculous progress summed up by this gift had taken place within his own lifetime, and characterized the telephone instrument as symbolic of the fact that distance on earth had now been annihilated. He then signed the formal receipt for the instrument, and Dr. Wetmore and Dr. Mrs. Grosvenor signed as witnesses. The instrument used by Theodore G. Miller during the round-the-world conversation has been placed in the Bell System Historical Museum at the Bell Telephone Laboratories in New York, where an example of every advancing step in the technical development of the telephone is permanently preserved and exhibited.

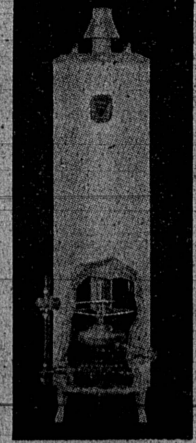
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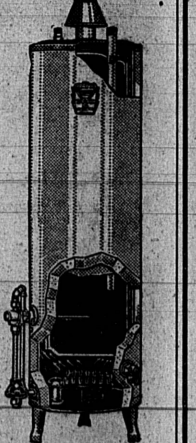
