ORDINANCE No. 270. CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA. PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS SAID CITY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$85,000.00 FOR THE ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENTS FOR SAID CITY AND FOR THE REDEMPTION OF SAID BONDS.

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County, California, in such funds as are, on the respective dates of payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds, legal tender for debts due the United States of America.

It is hereby certified and recited that all the conditions, acts and things required by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California to exist, to have happened and to have been performed, precedent to and in the issuance of this bond, exist, have happened, and have been performed, and that the issue of bonds of which this is one, together with all other indebtedness of said City of Torrance, is within every debt and other limit prescribed by the Constitution and laws of said State.

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Bonds and accruing interest thereon. That for the purpose of paying the principal and interest of said Building Bonds, the City Council of the City of Torrance, at the time of fixing the general tax levy and in the manner for such general tax levy provided, levy and collect annually each year until said bonds are paid, or until there shall be a sum in the treasury of said city set apart for that purpose sufficient to meet all sums coming due for the principal and interest on said bonds, a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest on said bonds, and also such part of the principal thereof as shall become due before the time for fixing the next general tax levy. Said tax shall be levied for municipal purposes and shall be collected at the time and in the same manner as other municipal taxes are collected, and shall forthwith be turned over and paid into a fund of the City of Torrance to be known as "1935 Building Bond Interest and Redemption Fund." Said fund shall be used for no other purpose than the payment of said bonds and accruing interest thereon.
