Narbonne High SCHOOL

A rare collection of interesting articles gathered on her world cruise by Mrs. Schwartz could be seen at Narbonne high in the main floor exhibit case all of last week.

Many of the attractive articles were brought from Japan. The students especially enjoyed the wigs showing the different styles of headdress worn by the Japanese women at the present time. There were also kimonos from Japan and Mandarin coats from China, an ebony elephant from Ceylon and many objects of interest from Egypt.

Mrs. Schwartz, who teaches English and dramatics, took a leave of absence last semester and made a cruise around the world.

Narbonne's Latin club, Societas Latina, under the direction of Miss Larson, are planning an assembly in honor of the Roman poet, Horace, on December 3. The same day they will also celebrate a Saturnalia.

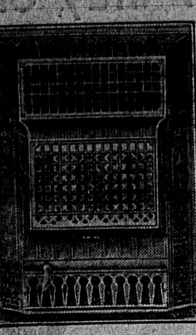
The celebration held last year was a great success and the residents of Lomita hope to eclipse that affair this year. The date for the program and distribution of children's gifts has not been set.
