Discovery Ranks Best

Lively Year At Tracks Brings Out New Talent; Best Season Since 1930

NEW YORK (U.P.)—Thoroughbred racing in 1935 enjoyed its most prosperous year since 1930 when the depression all but crippled the sport by the withdrawal of several prominent sportsmen from the game, a survey of records discloses.

While there were no Man O' Wars to capture the imagination of turf followers, the various divisions produced creditable representatives and a 21-year six furlong world track record was broken.

A record number of dead heats, numerous disqualifications and many deaths were written into the records and attendance and betting figures at the various tracks throughout the nation showed marked increases.

Alfred Gwynne Vanderbilt's Discovery, 4-year-old son of Display-Ariadne, was the undisputed champion thoroughbred of the year. With the enforced retirement of Mrs. Isabel Dodge Sloan's Cavalcade, Discovery's Nemesis in 1934, the Vanderbilt colt had a clear path to the title, winning 11 of his 19 starts and purses amount to \$102,455.

Discovery Slow At Start
 Discovery was late coming to hand. He finished out of the money in his seasonal debut in the Toboggan Handicap at Belmont Park on May 15 and was also beaten in four subsequent races.

On June 22 the stout-hearted champion found his stride at Aqueduct and won his first race, beating the fleet King Saxon and Omaha without effort. His winning string of eight, including the Detroit Challenge Cup, the Stars and Stripes, the Butler Handicap, a handicap at Suffolk Downs, the Arlington Handicap, the Wilson Stakes, and the Merchants and Citizens Handicap at Saratoga was not broken until August 21, when A. A. Baroni's Top Row beat him at Narragansett Park, August 21.

He returned to winning form in the Whitney Stakes at Saratoga and added the Hawthorne Gold Cup to his record before again meeting defeat by Top Row in the Massachusetts Handicap on October 16. On October 22 he won the Cincinnati Handicap by 12 lengths in the mud and returned to Maryland, his

native state, where he finished out of the money in the Washington Handicap at Laurel before retiring for the season.

Omaha Best 3-Year-Old
 William Woodward's Omaha, with earnings of \$142,255, was the largest money-winning thoroughbred and without question the outstanding 3-year-old. Duplicating the feat of Gallant Fox, his sire, who in 1932 won the Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Belmont Stakes, Omaha lacked the glamorous appeal of his illustrious daddy, but beat the best of his age before a mysterious ailment caused his retirement in the late summer.

Marshall Field's Tintagel was best of a poor lot of 2-year-olds. The bay son of Sir Galahad III, Heloise earned \$76,270, most of which came through his victory in the Belmont Futurity, Grand Slam, a Chance Play colt, was closely lapped on the Field colt for juvenile honors with a total of \$68,085 in purses.

Snaphack, racing in the colors of the Sanford Stud, is given the rating as leading steeple-chaser with earnings of \$7,925 for the year.

Vanderbilt Wins \$302,955
 A. G. Vanderbilt headed the list of money-winning owners with a total of \$302,955. The stable accounted for 88 races, 68 seconds and 78 thirds.

Hirsch Jacobs, who trains for the B. B. Stable, W. N. Adrians and Damon Runyon, led the list of trainers for the third consecutive year. He saddled the winners of more than a hundred races.

Wayne D. Wright, with 182 winners to his credit, was the recognized jockey champion at the close of the eastern racing season late in November.

The longest-priced straight mutuel was paid when Printemps, at \$500.24 for \$2, won at Washington Park, Illinois, early in June. The largest daily double—\$7,204.40 for \$2—was paid at Tropical Park in Margate.

A record number of dead heats were run when judges at various tracks were unable to name the actual winner in 12 races. Most notable of these was in the Saratoga Special, when C. V. Whitney's Red Rain and Coldstream Stud's Coldstream finished as a team in August.

Fouls in 80 Races
 Disqualifications also were numerous. At least 80 races were won on technicalities.

A new world record for six furlongs was established when

Clang defeated Myrtle Wood at that distance in a match race at Coney Island, Ohio, on October 11. Clang dashed the six panes in 1:09 1/5, two-fifths of a second faster than the mark set by Iron Mask at Juarez in 1914.

To the Arden Farms' Chance Play goes the distinction of being the leading sire because of the consistency of his get.

Camino Real and Gold Step, two mediocre selling players, were still fighting it out for the race-winning honors as the season neared its close. The first named won 15 races before going to Florida for a winning campaign, while Gold Step was still in active service at New Orleans with 14 winning races.

Time took its usual heavy toll among horsemen on and off the turf. One hundred deaths occurred during the year.

Slight Gain In Kentucky
 In 273 days of racing in Ohio \$6,982,478 was turned over in the mutual machines and Kentucky did a business of \$10,201,673. This is a slight increase over 1934 in both states.

For the 11 months preceding the Tropical Park meeting in Florida, 660,131 persons attended Florida races and sent \$20,109,345 into the machines, officials announced.

A paid attendance of 902,602 for 183 days of racing in Illinois at seven tracks was reported and a total of \$35,238,874 was put on the line in support of the gee gees.

Incomplete returns from California indicate \$28,000,000 will have been wagered at tracks in that state when the 1934 season ends at Santa Anita December 31. It is estimated that close to 1,400,000 persons will visit tracks in the state when the final figure is available.
