RULES
Governing Use of
Torrance Civic Auditorium

1. Positively no smoking allowed on the stage at any time.
2. No one, excepting the custodian in charge, is permitted to handle the equipment.
3. Those renting or reserving the building will be held responsible for any damage.
4. RENTAL RATES:
15% of gross receipts whenever general admission is charged.
25% of gross receipts whenever building is used for boxing, wrestling, or other athletic events.
Minimum charge, \$10.00, between hours of 6 a. m. and 6 p. m.
Minimum charge, \$15.00, between hours of 6 p. m. and 1 a. m.
A charge of \$1.00 per hour will be made for use of lights and stage for rehearsals.
A charge of \$5.00 will be made for use of the public address system.
No charge will be made for use of the auditorium when the public is admitted free, except when used for advertising, promotional purposes, or for political meetings, in which case the minimum charges will be made.
5. The City will allow no intoxicating liquors sold, served, or consumed on auditorium property.
6. Reservations will be made in order of application at the City Clerk's office at the City Hall. Permanent reservations for regular meetings of lodges and similar organizations will not be accepted.
7. All the above rules are subject to change without notice.

Candidates for Committeeman File Papers

Four Torrance Democrats are among the 18 candidates seeking seats on the party's county central committee in the 68th district, according to the official list given to the Torrance Herald today by W. M. Kerr, county registrar of voters.

The local candidates are Robert F. Lessing, 2019 220th street; Mrs. Edythe M. Miller, 2116 Gramercy avenue; James J. O'Toole, 1225 Madrid avenue, and Frank E. Perkin, 2208 Gramercy avenue.

The other 14 candidates for Democratic county central committee seats, most of whom are from Wilmington and San Pedro, are William Myerscough, of 20305 Bellepointe avenue, Harbor City; John B. Avian, Bartol O. Bertelson, Louis A. Boyd, Lee S. Buckley, William R. Earl, Marshall H. Feldman, Ole Olsen, all of Wilmington; and Lee Roy Halstead, Ceall O. Johnson, George T. Porter, Fred H. Story and William J. Mulligan, all of San Pedro.

Only seven Republicans got up nerve enough to file in the 68th district, and all of them gave San Pedro as their home port. Democratic wags remarked facetiously that they were "in drydock, and might possibly be in a fair state of preservation." They are A. E. "Chick" Henning, former Los Angeles city councilman; Charles J. Brinkerhoff, William S. Lepper, Marguerite A. Mann and Joe Raycraft.
