

### Filipinos Sail For the Islands

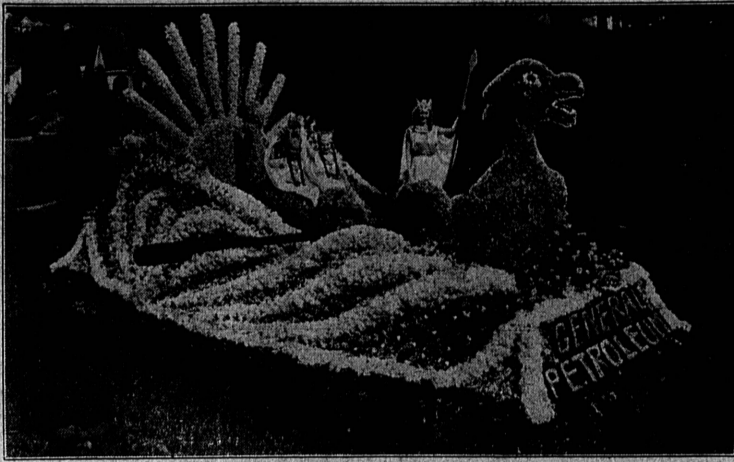

### Float Takes Sweepstakes Prize in Portland Rose Festival



General Petroleum's Huge Viking Ship, Created with Myriads of Beautiful Flowers

"Sheer dazzling loveliness" is the description given by Portland newspapers of the enormous Viking ship, fashioned of innumerable lovely blooms, which recently won the commercial sweepstakes prize for General Petroleum Corporation in Oregon's great annual rose parade of 1936.

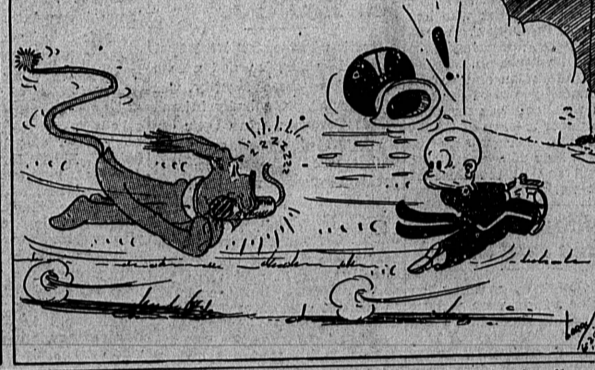
