### New Romantic Screen Team

A new romantic screen team is that formed by John Arledge and Louise Latimer in featured roles of "Two In Revolt," a unique motion picture drama of the friendship between a police dog and a thoroughbred horse. Shown next Wednesday only at the Torrance Theatre.
