

### Hollingsworth Killed in Crash


In a most unusual accident Sunday evening, C. B. Hollingsworth, prominent real estate dealer of San Pedro, met death and his wife was fatally injured when a runaway truck crashed into their car. Mr. and Mrs. Hollingsworth had driven to White's Point, and were seated in their car watching the sunset over the Pacific when a truck loaded with tomatoes went out of control on Dodson street, and plunged down the hill to smash against the Hollingsworth car. Mr. Hollingsworth was crushed to death in the machine and his wife died of her injuries Monday. Jeff Bragg, 1221 East 22nd street, driver of the truck, was held on suspicion of manslaughter.

Hollingsworth had been a resident and business man of San Pedro for many years. He was president of the Harbor Industrial Loan Company, and was widely known throughout the harbor district.

Nearly Lost Toe at the Age of Three; Had Pneumonia When Two Years Old; Overcomes Many Obstacles To Become America's Youngest Distance Runner

You have read newspaper and magazine articles about the time Bill Bonthron, injured his legs; Glenn Cunningham burned his legs, and doctors said that he would never walk, but Glenn overcame the handicap by walking and running, to become the world's greatest mile runner; now comes the yarn about the new sensation, little Archie San Romani, 1500-meter runner, who at the age of seven, was run over by an automobile. Doctors decided that his leg should be amputated, or he would never walk again, but no, his mother and one doctor decided to take a chance. The doctor nursed Archie along, and today he has established himself, a sophomore in college, as one of America's greatest middle-distance runners.


