Equipment At
Narbonne High**

Construction of Elementary Unit Expected to Start In August

Bids will be received Aug. 10 for construction of the new two-story classroom building proposed for the Lomita elementary school on Narbonne avenue, it is announced by the Los Angeles board of education.

The building, which will be of reinforced concrete construction, will be 61 by 185 feet in area, and will contain 18 rooms. The roof will be of reinforced concrete slab construction, and

floors will be of cement, tile and hardwood.

Estimated cost is \$100,000, according to the architectural division of the board of education. Bids also were to be taken by the board this week for movable equipment for the Narbonne high school, including gymnasium basket and rack assembly for the new building on the school grounds.

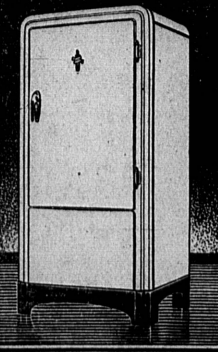
