Singing Longs Conduct Service

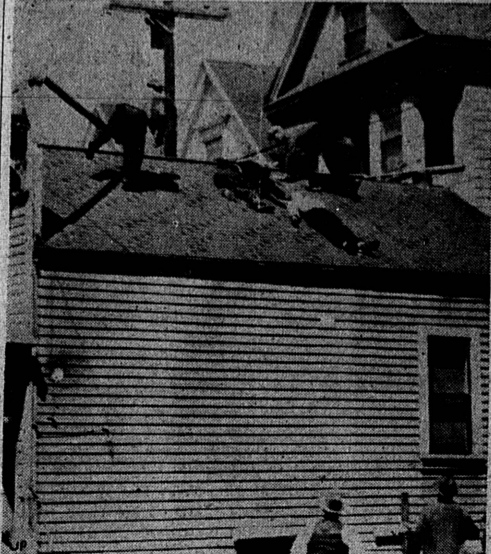

"Don Santore used to cut my hair 14 years ago when he had his shop in the Rol-Tan Hotel." Jack Isen volunteered from a chair in the Tansey Beauty and Barber Shop, 1623 Cabrillo.

"Yes, I came to Torrance from Pennsylvania in 1921 during the oil boom"—Don Santore turned from his work a moment. "You think living quarters are hard to find now? You should have seen it then. Things were so crowded that six of us had to share a room in the Erwin hotel; at six dollars a week too. Some were paying four dollars a week for a cot in the basement and sharing it with men from other shifts. That's the way it used to be here."
