Dealer Attends Flint Convention

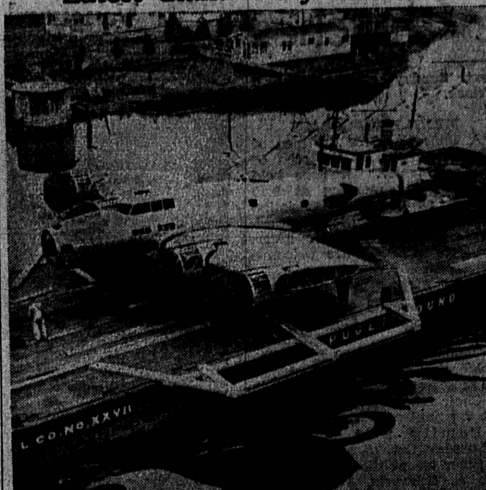

WHAT IS HOME WITHOUT A GARDEN?

The daffodils provide the first big color show of the spring. There are some of the minor bulbs which bloom earlier, such as the crocus and the snowdrop, but for quantity of color we look to the daffodil first.

Coming into bloom before the trees have leaved and the sun is still mild, they make a delightful display. If you will place them under trees in colonies, they will be partially shaded as the season advances and continue blooming for a longer period.

Another most effective practice is to tuck in bulbs in vacant spots all over the garden between other perennials and under the edges of shrubbery so that in their season the daffodils give character to the entire garden and then their leaves which are unsightly and floppy during their maturing period are concealed by the foliage of the perennials which mount above them and provide shade for the daffodils. For this purpose the older and cheaper daffodils and narcissi are ideal and furnish as fine an effect as can be obtained by the larger flowered and much more expensive modern hybrids.

The poetic types are favorites for woodland planting in combination with the native bluebell or mertensia and the wood phlox, phlox divaricata and the white wood lily, trillium grandiflorum. In the garden they are in season with the early tulips and the dwarf irises and smaller spring bulbs.

Some of them are delightfully fragrant and are prized for this feature as well as their beauty. The narcissus family offers the first long stemmed cutting material of spring. They are ideal cut flowers as is shown by the

quantities of daffodils forced and sold by florists each winter. The trumpet varieties are easily grown as house plants provided only that the atmosphere is not too dry, in which case buds often blast.

Marriage By Telegraph

55 Years Ago Recalled LA JUNTA, Colo. (U.P.)—With publicity stunt marriages of today being performed underground, in the air and underwater, Lee Gilland recalls that he was married by telegraph 55 years ago—and it was not a publicity stunt.

Gilland and his prospective bride were awaiting the preacher at La Junta, Feb. 2, 1881, when it was learned a flood had washed out a bridge at Las Animas, preventing the minister from reaching the scene of the wedding.

The chief dispatcher for the Santa Fe railroad permitted Gilland to use his office for the nuptials and the entire ceremony was performed by telegraph message between La Junta and Las Animas.
