IN REVIEW

'35 Tartar-Gaucha Clash

Always the outstanding football tangle of the bay district among prep-school squads, the 1935 Gaucho-Tartar game was a thrill classic that remains current in the conversation of local football addicts even on this late date.

Friday, Oct. 25, 1935, the two unbeaten, untied, local squads clashed on the turf of Griffin Field to settle the question of supremacy between two brilliant football teams and to determine the league championship. In the bitter battle that followed neither question was settled.

From the starting whistle the contest was a series of thrills. Flashy, hard-hitting players uncorked play after play of tricky, brilliant football that left some 2,000 spectators gasping with amazement.

Late in the first canto Torrance smashed thru for the first score which was immediately canceled in the first moments of the second quarter when the Narbonne varsity opened a determined drive that ended in a touchdown for the Gauchos and a tied score at the half.

In the third quarter both squads functioned with the skill and tactics credible to great college varieties, trading play for play and drive for drive with equal determination, leaving the period with the score unchanged.

In the closing quarter the Tartars took on renewed steam and with the completion of a brilliant pass deep into
