Something decidedly different in pictures with music comes to the Torrance theatre next Wednesday when "The Gay Desperado" begins a four-day engagement with Nino Martini, great singing star of radio, opera and films in the title role, and Ida Lupino and Leo Carrillo in supporting parts.

A gay, colorful romance laid below the Rio Grande, this second offering of the newly-formed Mary Pickford-Jesse L. 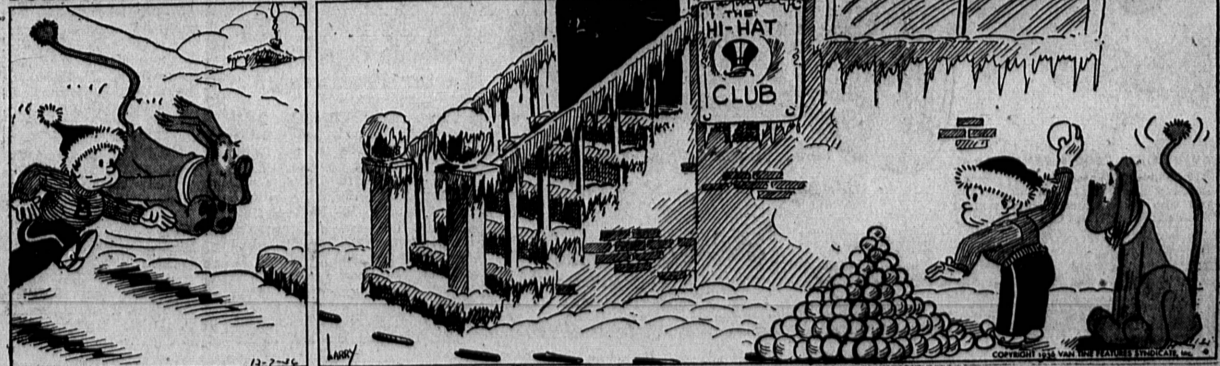
