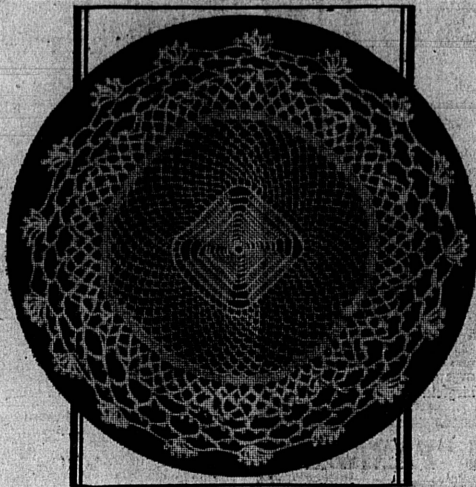

Paris Styles

PARIS. (U.P.)—Leather and suede jackets and vests are just as popular as they ever were for sports and country wear. The dyeing process has become so perfected in recent years that almost any delicate shade can be obtained altho the natural buff and tan shades remain the most popular choice.

The new hunting and sports jackets are carefully cut to fit closely to the body and they are perfectly tailored. High at the neck, they are made with a simple round collar or with revers that can be worn open or closed at the neck.

Sleeves are long and straight and are often slightly elevated at the shoulder line to give a squared, mannish effect. Patch pockets trim most the jackets—two at the hips and two breast pockets. The pockets often close with trim zipper fastenings, while zippers often run from the neck to waistline to close the front opening. Round, leather colored buttons are used just as frequently.

Many of the new sports jackets are trimmed with coarse peasant stitching that edges the front opening, the neckline, cuffs and pockets. The jackets are worn with tweed skirts that are cut swing style to insure freedom of movement. The divided skirts that were launched a few years ago have not proved popular as they are unbecoming to all but the very slender woman. The jacket or sleeveless vest of suede or leather is invariably shown with a scarf knotted high at the neck.
