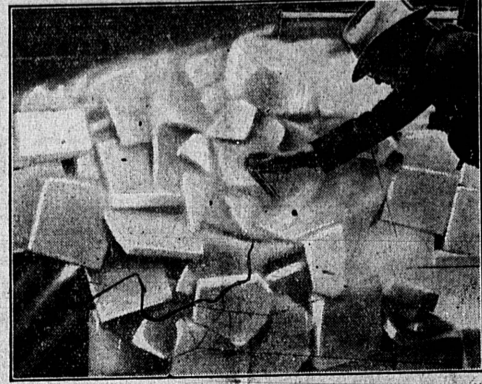
By a score of 8-7 the baseball team defeated Leuzinger, which was expected to capture the championship. Probably the most outstanding work was accomplished by the basketball team.
