Continuing the policy of equipping the officers' quarters with modern conveniences, the war department has awarded a contract to the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing Company through its Washington, D. C. office for 1487 electric refrigerators, according to B. J. Scott of the Torrance Electric Shop, local Westinghouse dealer.

"These refrigerators, of six and nine cubic foot sizes, will be installed in 30 army posts extending from the Atlantic to the Pacific coast and from the Canadian border to the Mexican boundary," Mr. Scott explained.

"Models selected by the government officials were of the 'C' line, recently announced by the Westinghouse company. These models were subjected to various tests, by the officials directing the purchase. A group of war department engineers headed up by J. R. Gramm, senior engineer, construction division, office quartermaster general, U. S. war department, visited the East Springfield plant of the Westinghouse company to complete the tests and make final arrangements for the shipment of the electric refrigerators," the local Westinghouse representative concluded. He added that the 'C' line of refrigerators is now on display at his store at 1419 Marcella avenue.

Summer Tours To Mexico Planned By So. Pacific

Labor difficulties at Pacific ports, even though they continue, will not affect the combined rail and water circle tours to Mexico arranged for this summer, according to word received here today by L. Overman, DPA Southern Pacific Lines.

The first of these novel tours is to leave Los Angeles on July 15 over the Southern Pacific and return over the Santa Fe route. Various Southern California cities have made reservations for the trip.

An all-rail summer vacation tour through Mexico that includes a side trip to Carlsbad Caverns on the return journey will depart on July 23, while two rail and water excursions are scheduled for the following month with departures on August 9 and 27. Most of the vacationists, remain in Mexico from two to four weeks.

How Masters Play

Of the 30 games to determine the world championship in chess, 25 have been played. Dr. A. A. Alekhin, the present champion, has won eight games and drawn 14. P. D. Bogoljubov, the contender, has won but three games from Dr. Alekhin.

The fifteenth game was a Queen's Gambit played to 70 moves and declared a draw. As the Queen's Gambit is considered the granddaddy of chess, it is interesting to follow the contest of masters through the 70 moves:
