I rather believe that our modern "Christmas Spirit" is the world's substitute for the grand old "Spirit of Christmas" which was so dear to true hearts of our fathers. I also fear that today our children are being taught too much about "a giver" and far too little about "The Giver" and the "Gift." Christmas should mean more than "good business." It should mean good hearts, peace to men of good will—"God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son" to us men and for our salvation, on that first Christmas Day. This is the spirit that we as Christians should keep alive. We give gifts because He gave "The Gift" and we share in his divine plan.

The Spirit of Christmas is the keeping alive the great truth of the Christian Religion that when the fullness of time came, God sent forth his son, born of woman.

For us men and for our salvation God the Son came down from heaven, and was made man. In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was God; and the word became flesh, and dwelt among us. From all eternity he was God, receiving his divine life and nature from God the Father. When the time of preparation of the world was fulfilled, he became man. He did not cease to be God, but he joined together human nature with divine nature in his Person, that all mankind might be brought into union with God through him. This is called the Incarnation, a word which means Being made flesh. Christmas is the season at which this fact is commemorated and the Christmas Spirit should be a spirit of Holy Joy for Jesus is born in Bethlehem and we have seen his star and have accepted him as our gift.

Do You Operate Under A FICTITIOUS FIRM NAME?

• If so, have you complied with the requirements of Section 2466 of the Civil Code, which says: "Every person and every partnership transacting business . . . under a fictitious firm name . . . must file . . . a certificate stating the name in full and the place of residence of such person and the members of such partnership . . . Such certificate must be published once a week for four consecutive weeks."

• If you have neglected this procedure, do you realize that the name of your firm is not protected, and that you are not entitled to maintain suits in the courts of the State of California?
