

Lomita Sewer to Be Completed This Afternoon

New Application For Storm Drain Will Be Presented In Two Weeks

The Lomita sanitary sewer project, representing a \$250,000 Christmas gift to the residents of Lomita, was scheduled to be completed to the last house connection Thursday afternoon, it was announced today by the county surveyor's office in Los Angeles.

Work on the project was begun under the Civil Works Administration on December 15, 1933, and continued under the State Emergency Relief Administration. Both labor and materials were furnished by the federal government. Labor alone amounted to \$264,332, and materials some \$90,000.

The new application to the SERA for labor and materials with which to construct the proposed Lomita storm drain will be ready to file with the SERA in approximately two more weeks, it was learned today at the office of the county surveyor in Los Angeles.

The old application has been withdrawn, and the new application, providing for a different routing in order that the district may be afforded better relief from flood waters, is being prepared for submission in its place, according to C. E. Arnold, storm drain engineer who has directed the recently-completed Lomita sanitary sewer and other projects throughout the county.

Torrance Vote Total Is Reduced By 813 Names Since November 6

The names of 813 persons previously registered as voters from Torrance have been dropped from the great register, it was announced today by W. M. Kerr, registrar of voters.

The city's new total now stands at 3157, of whom 1749 are Democrats and 1253 are Republicans. The total registration for the November 6 election was 3970, showing the loss of 813.

Figures for some of the other areas were given as follows: Lomita, new total, 2232; cancelled, 506. Gardena, new total, 1969; cancelled, 442.

Registrar Kerr announced that the new total registration for the county now stands at 1,017,930, of whom 518,833 are Democrats and 433,038 are Republicans. Democrats have nearly a 100,000 lead over the Republicans. A total of 287,597 names were dropped.

Total votes cast in Torrance at the November 6 election also was announced by Kerr. The total was given as 3071, out of a total registration of 3970 voters for the election.

A state law now compels the registrar of voters to go through his great register following every general election, and strike off the names of persons who did not vote at either the primary or the final election.

Two years ago, following the presidential election, Kerr cancelled 220,814 names from his books, but the work was not completed until January 25, 1933, he explained.

County Files Many Applications For Labor Under SERA

Embodiment projects from which practically every community will benefit, Los Angeles county has filed 260 applications for SERA labor with the Los Angeles county relief administration, according to a report filed with the board of supervisors today.

Total personnel requested of the LACRA, thus far, was given as 19,540, some 4900 being on sanitary sewer and other projects under the county surveyor, and 4839 for sewing projects under the county charities department. Third largest was the county road department, with 2900 personnel, on La Tijera, South Riverside drive and other projects.

A total of 110 of the 260 applications have been approved by the LACRA, the LACRA having some into being after some of the county projects were started. Thirty-four applications now are pending, and 75 are in operation.

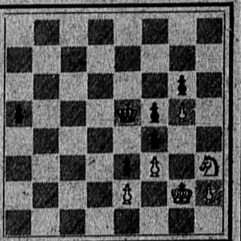

We have a document at hand which we think should be of interest to the reader because of its unique historical value. In this document, Aylmer Maude tells of a game which he played with the famous Russian novelist, Leo Tolstoy, at his home the year before his death. Count Tolstoy was then 81, and an invalid, who had to be wheeled about in a bath-chair. He was, moreover, much distressed by his wife's mutual condition at the time. Mr. Maude, therefore, attaches no importance to the game, except as being one of the very few recorded games of Tolstoy's (he gave two in his "Life of Tolstoy") and as never having been published before.
