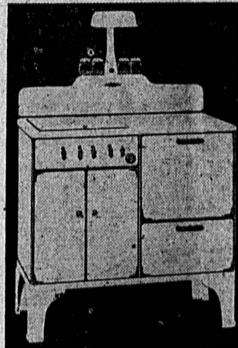

Fourteen Days Remain To Pay Taxes Before Penalty Applies

With the deadline for payment of current taxes less than three weeks off, collections took a sharp upward jump this week and are now running at over \$200,000 daily, with each day showing an increase over the day preceding.

April 20 is the last day for the payment of current taxes without a penalty. After that date a penalty of three per cent is added, plus 50 cents for each item on the tax bill.

Mysteries of Mexico to Be Told in Talk



The last day for the redemption of property on the partial payment plan also falls on April 20. Receipts for this year continue to run something more than four percent greater than on the corresponding day last year. The latest figures, giving receipts up to noon April 2, show collections of \$49,739,712.34, or 56.81 percent of the total charge of \$87,542,045.55. On the corresponding day last year, the collections were \$46,760,825.66, or 52.62 percent of the total charge of \$88,863,171.91.

A plea to taxpayers to avoid the last minute rush was made today by H. L. Byram, county tax collector. "The taxpaying public," Byram stated, "have been accustomed to delay paying taxes until the last week, and as a result cause themselves great inconvenience and delays due to the congestion which has always occurred. "When it is realized that over 80 percent of the collections for both the first and second installments in the past have been paid during the last week preceding the dead line, it is apparent that many taxpayers could co-operate to mutual advantage and greatly improve the tax collection service."

Dinglo sustained lacerations to his scalp that required 100 stitches to repair, and his sister, Miss Della Dinglo, was also severely cut about the head.

Battery's Last Survivor Dead MANSFIELD, Ohio. (U.P.)—Abraham Myers, 92, believed to be the last survivor of the first Ohio Independent battery which served in the Civil War, is dead. Myers fought in the battle of Antietam and was in Washington when Lincoln was assassinated.
