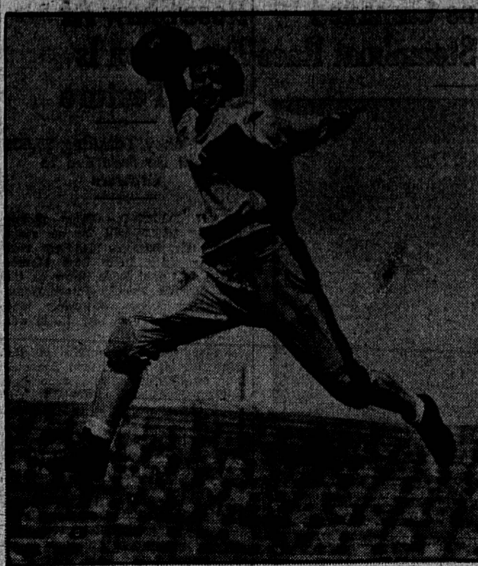

GOLF CLUB STOLEN

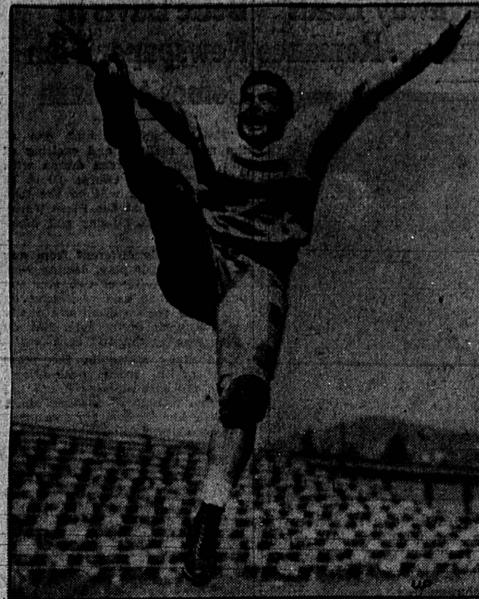

Professional Boxing Gets Away To Good Start At Westside

With professional boxing off to a flying start last Friday night, the Westside Auditorium, 645 West Anaheim street, Long Beach, promises the fight fans the best talent obtainable in professional boxing. There is a great deal of difference between professional and amateur boxing.

Whereas the amateurs may appear awkward and many times ludicrous, the professionals know what it is all about and go about their business in the ring in a masterful manner. Local fight fans have seen so little of the professional style of boxing that it may be a little time before they become educated and able to appreciate the better qualities of the professional game. The Westside means to popularize the four-round professional fights. This will assure the fans action from start to finish as the bouts of last Friday will testify. There was not an idle second nor a moment of stalling in all of the seven bouts.

Last Friday's card produced a star in the person of Jerry Breslin. In his fight with Johnny Lynch, Breslin hit Johnny hard enough to kill a human being, knocking him cold, leaving the spectators believing the boy was dead from the effects of this devastating punch. Breslin has had 13 fights in his professional career and 12 of them have been knock-outs. Oldtimers at the ringside last Friday buzzed it around that Jerry's left hook was harder than the left hook of the famous Bob Fitzsimmons. Matchmaker Kid Mexico, says that Breslin will pack the Westside arena this Friday as Jerry has the earmarks of a coming champion. He weighs 175 pounds and is the picture of physical perfection.

BUCK HUNTING costs the hunter MANY BUCKS

The average cost to the hunter of buck deer shot in California this season is a hundred and eighty bucks—meaning dollars; and the kill will be about 74,000 bucks—not dollars. These figures are estimates by veteran rangers and furnished the outing bureau of the Automobile Club of Southern California by the U. S. forest service.

Probably 115,000 hunters will spend an average of four or five days in the mountains and one out of every seven will get a set of horns. They will spend about \$25 each, thereby spreading \$2,875,000 among sporting goods dealers, resorts, hotels, garages and local communities.

Rangers figure that only one out of 300 hunters will be careless with fire, but that one is something to worry about.
