

Pete took double pneumonia, while Louis only contracted it on one lung. Both boys nearly lost their lives, but the family physician was fortunate in saving both pa-tients, later advising the ir parents to move to California, or both of the boys would be sickly the rest of their lives. At the age of 17, Louis Zam-perini broke the world's inter-scholastic, mile run record, his time as everyone in Torrance knows by heart, 4 minutes, 21 and 3:10 seconds. Louis has a chest expansion of 7¹/₂ inches, runs with a stride of 7 feet, is 5 feet, 11 inches in height, and tips the scales at 140 pounds, when in shape; another advan-tage that the "Tornado" has slow heart-beat of 55, most peo-ple have a beat of around 73. Loves to Box Louis, who is the youngest distance runner to ever make the American Olympic team, keeps himself in shape by talk-and has told this writer many times that the ver had arms in shape; loves a good 'steak, and eats several a week while in training. Louis does not like the 5000 meter run (3 miles, 188 yards), and has told this writer many times that the ver had any boys that they would either be pole vaulters or shot putters. He loves to run the mile or 1500-meter race, and will return to these events next year, as a freshman at the University of Southern California. Louis ex-pects to run the 1800-meter event in the 1940 Olympics, only switching to the longer run for the present games, because he feit that he lacked the experi-ence to match strides with such old heads as Verzke, Cunning-ham, Bonthron and several other "Jadi timers."

"old timers." Louis gives the credit for his fast elimb to the top of track to his former coach, Bernie Donahue, and his brother Pete. The latter has watched, helped, trained and taught him many tricks of the trade. He al-so gives his mother credit for her wonderful cooking, and his father for the advice and cheer that only a father and mother are able to give.
