District Director Walter E. Carr of the immigration and naturalization service at Los Angeles, reports that it is the present plan to arrange a Filipino repatriation party to sail from Los Angeles harbor on the SS "President Coolidge," Sept. 28, 1936. This vessel will also pick up a party of Filipino repatriates at San Francisco, leaving that port on Oct. 2, 1936.

Director Carr also states that funds are again available to permit the furnishing of transportation for American-born children of Filipino repatriates from the state of California.

In order to secure transportation on the "President Coolidge," Sept. 28, all interested Filipinos should file their applications with the nearest immigration and naturalization office promptly.



### Spectacular Entertainment and Gorgeous Decorations For Fair

POMONA, Sept. 10.—Beauty will vie with talent for the center of the spotlight among the countless entertainment features at Los Angeles county fair in Pomona, Sept. 18 to 4, according to the announcement of fair officials. More spectacular, more elaborate and more varied than ever before, the attractions bid fair to set a precedent for the huge agricultural and industrial exposition.

Each year a new and startling theme of decoration is carried out, and this year the super-modernistic idea is the incentive for bizarre creations. The interior of the sightly palace of agriculture will afford a glamorous spectacle in which the rainbow hues of its color creations will combine with lighting effects so new and novel as to beggar description.

An 800-foot electrical fixture, the longest ever built, dangled on either side by a hundred giant chandeliers each 12 feet high, will furnish the illumination for the building. Incidentally, the chandeliers are made of "celloglass," a substitute for glass being used for the first time. Over 20,000 yards of especially made onion cloth will hide the steel ceiling girders. Thousands of feet of mural decorations extend along the side walls. Great medallions of gold cloth form the setting for other features.

While the mighty historical pageant parade, the dally horse racing and the brilliant night horse show are outstanding attractions, they form only a small part of the wonderful program which, thruout the 17 days, will constitute an ever changing panorama of music, mirth and amusement. There will be something to fit every taste.

Stars of the screen, stage and radio will be enthusiastic participants. Headed by Shirley Temple, the delegation from Hollywood will include such notables as Warner Baxter, Bill Robinson, Patsy Kelly, Norma Shearer, Bob Burns, Martha Raye, Clark Gable, Jeannette MacDonald, Nelson Eddy, Fred Stone, Leo Carillo and many others.


