A star rugby team from the H. M. S. Apollo, flagship of the West Indies squadron of the British navy, will play an outstanding team picked from the ranks of the Southern California Rugby Union.

Intense interest in the coming match is being manifested in the British film colony at Hollywood, and several notables of the screen world are expected to attend. Of particular interest is the fact that Boris Karloff, the star of many sinister melodramas, will cast off his "Frankenstein" role and as an old rugby fan, act as a "touch" judge.
