Early Bids Asked To Beat Increase In Steel Cost

Dec. 15 has been set by the board of supervisors for opening bids for furnishing and installing the four steel penstocks, valves and appurtnant structures for the outlet works of San Gabriel dam No. 1, one of the largest dams in the world outside of the Booneville and Wheeler projects under way by the federal government.

By advertising for bids before Jan. 1, the flood control district will avoid an increase in the price of steel that would amount to between \$3,000 and \$4,000 on the work, according to C. H.
