County and City  
Tax Figures Told

Setting an all-time record, tax payments of \$59,803,224 have been made by Los Angeles county taxpayers for the first half of the fiscal year just ended, it was announced this week by H. L. Byram, county tax collector.

The payments represent 87 percent of the total billing of \$104,477,560, the largest in the history of the county and are \$6,289,047 over the 1935 tax collection for the same period. County school taxes, as well as municipal taxes of the cities for which the county collects the taxes are included in the figures.

In the city of Torrance collections for the half year, were \$146,972.89, which represents 68.45 percent of the year's total charge of \$214,731.17. This compares with the 1935-36 half-year record which showed collections of \$130,925.37 against a charge of \$196,440.11, or a total of 66.65 percent collected.

Request By Moose  
Is Clarified

Officers and members of the Torrance Moose lodge this week through A. H. Bartlett requested The Herald to correct its report last Thursday that the lodge asked the city council for funds to defray convention expenses at Sacramento this coming fall.

They pointed out that the council was asked for funds to help defray the cost of advertising the city through the use of "animated" letters spelling out the city's name, which proved a feature of the Long Beach gathering of Moose last year. These letters must be redecorated and some replaced. They are very large and when carried, present the name Torrance a block wide. The lodge is not asking for money to go to the convention, Bartlett said.
