SEALED PROPOSALS will be received at the office of the City Clerk, City Hall, City of Torrance, California, until 8:00 o'clock P. M., on February 9, 1937, at which time they will be publicly opened and read, for performing work as follows:
City of Torrance, Narbonne Avenue from southerly line of Sepulveda Boulevard to the southerly line of 240th Street (about one (1) mile in length), work to be done as follows:

UNIT "A"
Item 1. Grading—
Necessary grading to place a strip of 6" asphaltic concrete pavement 7 feet in width along the westerly side of the present paved roadway from the southerly line of Sepulveda Boulevard to the southerly line of 240th Street—quantity about 3510 sq. yds. of finished grading.

Item 2. Headers—
Furnish in place 4500 feet of 2"x6" R.O.P. headers.

Item 3. New Pavement—
Provide in place 31,591 sq. ft. 6" thick asphaltic concrete requiring 1185 tons of asphaltic concrete.

Item 4. Resurfacing—
Resurface with asphaltic concrete 1 1/4" thick 113,249 sq. ft. requiring 850 tons of asphaltic concrete.

Item 5. Curb—
(a) Excavation for curb 60 cubic yards.
(b) Construct 4780 lin. feet of 15" standard concrete curb.

UNIT "B"
Item 1. Sidewalk—
(a) Excavation 440 cubic yards.
(b) Construct 14,990 sq. ft. of sidewalk.
(c) Remove culvert head walls at 237th Street and 240th Street and construct new head wall at 237th Street.
(d) Furnish in place 55 lin. ft. of 16 gauge 24" Armo corrugated iron culvert pipe as shown on plans.

Contractors may submit bids on Unit "A" or Unit "B" or both. However, if proposals are submitted to cover both Units, separate bids must be offered. Combined bids covering both Units will not be considered.

No bid will be received unless it is made on a proposal form furnished by the City Engineer. Each bid must be accompanied by cash, certified or cashier's check, or bidder's bond made payable to the City of Torrance for an amount equal to at least ten (10) per cent of the amount bid, such guaranty to be forfeited should the bidder to whom the contract is awarded fail to enter into the contract.

A deposit of \$500 will be made by contractor when Plans and Specifications are taken from City Engineer's office. Refund will be made upon return of plans.

The City of Torrance reserves the right to reject any and/or all bids submitted.
