Yesterday (Ash Wednesday) ushered in the Lenten season which is observed by many of the churches in this community. Fasting will be an important topic until Easter Sunday, Mar. 28. Parties promise to be few until after this date, when milady will burst forth in her gayest summer frock and bonnet for, mind you, the jolly prints that boast everything from blossoms to cabins and worn with large hats are most effective.

Every hostess or group will strive to have the first post Lenten affair and the appetizing menus will be more than greatifying to those loyal few, who have observed the full 40-day fasting period.

The word Lent originally meant spring. It's coming at the time when many-churches are preparing for the great feast of Easter, proved most confusing. The fasting or Lent was at one time but 40 hours instead of 40 days and no food was eaten from Good Friday afternoon until Sunday morning. The Montanists, second century folk, observed two weeks of rigid fasting and by the mildle of the Third Century all Holy Week was observed.

Lenten Trends Reviewed

The 40-day idea came into being about 236 A.D., but strictly fasting was not observed timely the Seventh Century. Early Rome observed three weeks of fasting, but had feast days at broken intervals. The ancient Greeks named their festival, 'six weeks of fasting,' excluding Holy week. England observed in the Six weeks of fasting,' excluding Holy week. Those who observe this period take the example originally set down by the prophets Moses and Elljah to commemorate the fasting of Christ.
