L. A. County Officials Want Local Man On State Commission

Los Angeles county officials will urge the appointment of a Los Angeles county man to succeed Harry A. Hopkins on the state highway commission. It was learned this week at the Hall of Records.

Hopkins has resigned to seek the office of an upstate Congressman who died recently. It has been reported in official circles that Governor Frank Merriam would not appoint a successor to Hopkins until after the election, so that Hopkins could go back to his former job should he be defeated at the contest.

Chairman Roger W. Jessup of the board of supervisors said he would lend his support to a campaign for the support of a Los Angeles county man as Hopkins' successor. Supervisor Roland M. Ford of the Fourth (Torrance) district, chairman of the supervisors' roads and highways committee, said he also would favor the appointment of a local man.

Members of the board of supervisors are spending the greater part of this week at Sacramento at a convention of the State Supervisors Association, and something may be forthcoming upon their return, it was indicated.

Do You Know the Law? . . . by KENNETH B. HUGHES Attorney at 1313 Sartori Ave.

MARRIAGE
Prompted by the fact that Spring is just around the corner, as well as by more practical considerations, this and an ensuing article will deal with the Marriage Laws of California. Limited space forbids a full discussion of all aspects of the subject—including the much debated matter of whether marriages are really made in Heaven.

Definition: Marriage is a personal relationship arising out of Civil Contract, to which the consent of parties capable of making that contract must be given. While mutual consent is thus a necessary ingredient, consent alone will not constitute a marriage in California. Some form of solemnization authorized by the Civil Code must follow the making of the contract to make it valid. In our State, we have no so-called "common-law" marriage—no length of cohabitation being sufficient to validate a relationship not conforming to the Code.

Parties: Males over the age of 21 and females over the age of 18 are deemed capable of consent required for the marriage contract. But a male between 18 and 21, and a female between 16 and 18 may so consent if the written consent of parent or guardian is filed with the license clerk. Also, males under 18, and females under 16 may be married in special situations if consent of parent AND of the Superior Court is obtained.

Additional to age requirements, the parties must be single, mentally aware of the nature of their act; physically capable of the relationship, and not so closely related as to render the union incestuous. White persons may not marry Negroes, Mongolians, Malaysians, nor Mutattoes.

Formalities: A license must be secured upon prior application made from 3 to 30 days before ceremony. No special ceremony is required, but parties must declare they take each other as husband and wife. The marriage may be solemnized by any Judge, City Recorder, priest, or minister of any denomination. All marriages contracted OUTSIDE of California, which are valid by laws of the country where contracted, will be valid here. The big objection to Mexican marriages is that they failed to satisfy California requirements, but they were not even valid in Mexico when laws of that country had not been observed. But marriages which are incestuous, polygamous, or otherwise against public policy (ie, companionate marriages etc.) are bad in California, even though legally contracted elsewhere.

Marriages contracted under circumstances justifying an annulment—party under age of consent; result of fraud; force; or unsound mind—are voidable, and are valid until adjudged null and void.

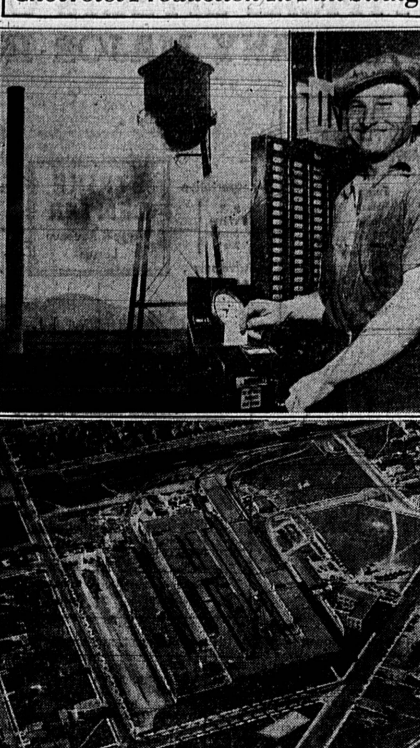
A subsequent marriage (a second one) is void from the beginning unless:
1. The first marriage is annulled or dissolved by law or death; or
2. The former spouse is absent and not known to be alive for 5 years; or is generally believed dead at the time of the second marriage. This law takes care of the celebrated "Enoch Arden" situation where one spouse disappears for a long time and the other remarries.

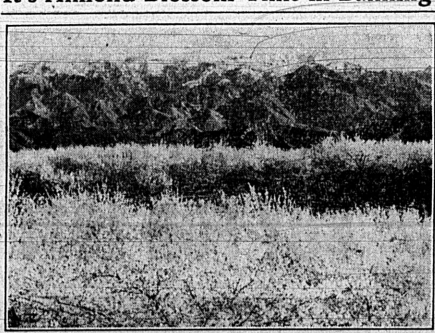

State Auto Death Toll Greatest In History

SACRAMENTO, March 18—(U.P.)—Speed and death rode hand in hand on California highways, in 1936, claiming the greatest toll of life in the state's history.

Pleading for safer driving and less speed, Ray Ingels, director of the state department of motor vehicles, said California's traffic death toll of 3,132 was the highest in the nation. Final tabulations showed the 1936 casualty list to exceed by 11.6 percent that of 1935.

Personal injuries from an increased number of automobile collisions also advanced. In addition to the staggering list of fatalities, 49,326 persons were injured in 36,316 accidents. In 1935, 47,078 people were hurt in 33,729 accidents.

Motor Cops May Convoy Busses

Motor policemen should be instructed to follow school busses to create more traffic consciousness among drivers when overtaking and passing school busses, the Los Angeles board of education recommended this week to the State Highway Patrol.

The recommendation was made following investigation of an accident involving a school bus and a student of Van Nuys high school. The committee report recommended "that a bulletin be prepared by the L. A. board of education for distribution to all drivers of their school busses, instructing them to further familiarize themselves with the provisions of the law governing pupil transportation, issued by the state department of education."

The report also recommended "that the State Highway Patrol and the Los Angeles police department instruct their officers to direct special attention of the public to the regulation, and if advisable, to instruct motor policemen to follow school busses for a time in order to create motor traffic consciousness among drivers when overtaking and passing school busses."
