Congressman Colder at the Capitol

WASHINGTON, March 20.—(Special to The Herald)—It would be grand if Congress could legislate with mathematical certainty, but it cannot be done. A bill is thoroughly discussed in a committee, hearings are held in which the proponents and the opponents discuss the bill pro and con, it reaches the floor and the critics point out its defects; it goes to the Senate and the same process occurs again. When the bill is finally signed by the President the administrators of the act place interpretations upon the bill not dreamed of by those who enacted it; then the courts pass on the law frequently and they place new interpretations upon it. Like planting a seed, it is difficult to predict just what the fruit will be.

A case in point is the Neutrality bill. Everyone is disgusted with war. The failure of European nations to pay their war debts, and the present armament race, has brought about a distrust among nations that has been rarely equaled in the history of the world. Powerful nations break their treaties ruthlessly and disregard the rights of their neighbors. It is a hectic world mess.

Furthermore, it is very difficult for a nation to be neutral, especially America. A big majority of Americans usually sympathize with the under dog, and we naturally are friends and partisans of the oppressed. We are a people of considerable national emotion and it is our custom to have pronounced opinions with one side or another. It is difficult for us to be neutral in a dog fight or a street brawl and we particularly resent a bully who takes advantage of those of inferior physical strength, and that feeling is expressed not only toward individuals but toward nations.

In framing a neutrality bill we face a very difficult situation. The Senate bill provides that in case of war no war materials shall be shipped to the nations participating. The House bill places the responsibility on the President and permits him

to declare an embargo at his discretion. The House bill provides that nations at war may bring their own ships into our waters and purchase certain supplies. That sounds fair on its face, but when we consider that the British and French fleets control the Atlantic and Japan controls the Oriental Pacific, such a neutral bill in its final analysis will be a tremendous advantage to the nations that have ships and navies and a disadvantage to the nations that have not.

But it is a new experiment to maintain peace. As a nation we desire to preserve peace, not only for ourselves, but for our neighbors and for the nations of the world. But many believe while it may restrain, and hope it will have a beneficial effect, it will not keep us out of war in present world conditions. A majority of us believe that it may be of some help. There is an overwhelming sentiment among members of Congress to keep our nation out of war, but 12 votes in opposition.
