

Snow Still Closes Sierra Pass Roads

Three important Sierra pass roads remain closed to thru travel by winter conditions. The Sonora Pass road from Sonora is open and good thru Long Barn and as far as Strawberry, where snow closes the road as a thru route.

The Silver lake road is open and good from Jackson to a point 25 miles east, thence closed. The Ebbetts Pass road is good from Angels Camp to Camp Connell, which is the end of the winter maintained road.

Fire Lookouts Start Monday

Fire lookout towers thruout the county's watersheds, dusty after a half year's vacancy, will have their shutters removed and their windows shined in readiness for their new occupants next Monday.

The occasion, according to an announcement from Spence D. Turner, county forester and fire warden, will be the commencement of the fire season in Los Angeles county, brought on by the increasing flammability of mountain shrubs and other vegetation, which have already been the cause of numerous small fires.

The observers will go to their lonely posts for a stay of approximately six months—until the rainy season in the fall. In some of the remote peaks the lookouts will prepare their own meals and sleep in the towers; at others they will live in an adjacent cabin; while at two others they will be able to spend their nights in town.

The ten towers operated by the Department of County Forester and Fire Warden will include two new ones which will be opened for the first time, one at Temple and the other on Tejon mountain, near Gorman.

Constitution Exhibit at Famed Library

On May 25, 1787, the Federal convention at Philadelphia actually began the work of framing a constitution for the United States. On the 150th anniversary, the Huntington library will show an exhibition of manuscripts, documents, and printed books to commemorate that event. The exhibition will be displayed until Sept. 17, the date on which the completed constitution was signed by the delegates.

Rare copies of the drafts of the constitution in its several stages are shown in the exhibition. These were in the form of reports of committees and were printed only for the delegates to the convention. Few copies have survived. The official draft of the constitution, printed for the use of members, is also exhibited.

Magnificent Ranges Extend for 200 Miles In Mt. Whitney Area

Towering majestically 14,496 feet, Mt. Whitney, the highest peak in continental United States, stands beckoning to the eager vacationist, urging him to tear himself away from the complexities of modern economic life to explore the vast open spaces of the High Sierra region.

For the recreationist who wants to tear himself away from the rest of the busy world, five to eight hours' driving from Torrance over smooth ribbons of concrete is all that is required to transport him into nature's wonderland. Then a few hours by pack train will take him into a trailless virgin wilderness—remote from the nerve-racking hustle and bustle of city life—where human beings are few. For the more gregarious soul there are countless resorts and ideal camp grounds nestled away in an inspiring mountain setting, easily accessible by motor over good roads.

Angler's Paradise

To those who are thrilled by the savage strike of the gamey trout this is the land of the angler's dream. By rough estimate there are 3000 lakes and 10,000 miles of streams inviting the disciples of Izaak Walton to take their limits. This count is only an approximation, for this lofty fastness from Mount Whitney to the Sonora Pass section is too vast to be visited by any one person and hundreds of lakes and streams in the back country are seldom invaded.

For those who venture back into the higher altitudes by pack train limits may be taken for granted. A Sierra pack trip to be most satisfactory should be carefully planned with the help of experts who know the country, the outing bureau of the club suggests. Numerous ranches and packing stations afford horses, guides and packers, and some exceptionally fine districts may be reached by a short trail ride of a few hours. With the country a treasure house of sport and natural wonders for the fisherman, hunter or photographer, camping trips may be planned for two days or for months. 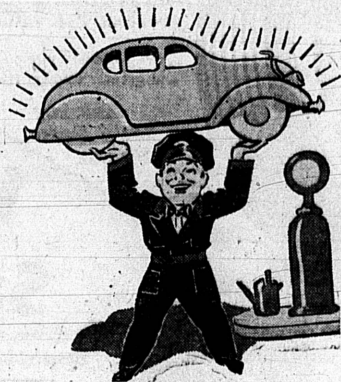
