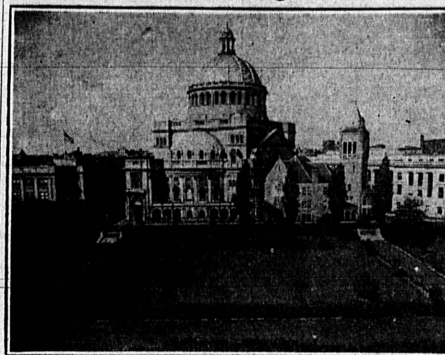
The Psalmist's words, "In God is my salvation and my glory: the rock of my strength, and my refuge, is in God," constitute the Golden Text in the Lesson-Sermon on "God the Preserver of Man" on Sunday in all branches of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Massachusetts.

A Scriptural selection in the Lesson-Sermon cites Jeremiah's words: "Blessed is the man that trusteth in the Lord, and whose hope the Lord is. For he shall be as a tree planted by the waters, and that spreadeth out her roots by the river, and shall not see when heat cometh, but her leaf shall be green; and shall not be careful in the year of drought, neither shall cease from yielding fruit." Another selection includes Paul's words to the Corinthians: "And God is able to make all grace abound toward you: that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound in every good work: . . . Being enriched in every thing to all bountifulness, which causeth through us thanksgiving to God."

One of the passages from "Salience and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy, states: "The divine Mind that made man maintains His own image and likeness."

BOSTON, Mass., June 7.—Progress of Christian Science expressed in the organization and recognition of fifty-nine new churches and societies; in sales increases of 66 percent for the writings of Mary Baker Eddy, discoverer and founder of Christian Science, in an increasingly friendly public thought as reflected by legislative bodies when handling measures involving medical and religious freedom; and in much good healing work; featured reports today by church officers at the Annual Meeting of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist.

### COSTLY SESSION

The 52nd session of the California legislature cost the state approximately a quarter million dollars, according to estimates prepared by State Comptroller Harry B. Riley.

The election of Judge Clifford P. Smith of Newton, Mass., as church president for the coming year, and of Edward L. Ripley of Brookline as treasurer, and Ezra W. Palmer of Marshfield as clerk, was announced. The president is elected by the Christian Science board of directors to serve for one year. His duty is to be presiding officer at the annual meeting.

Clifford P. Smith, C.S.B., L.L.B., became interested in Christian Science at Mason City, Iowa, in 1896, where he practiced law before becoming judge of the District Court of Iowa, the superior court of that state. He has been a member of The Mother Church since 1902.

The fact that the Christian Science denomination has 2,781 branches was cited and Miss M. Rosamond Wright, manager of the department of branches and practitioners, reported further for the year, "Good growth in our movement is shown through the organization and recognition of fifty-nine new churches and societies as branches of The Mother Church, and six new university organizations. Twenty-five of these branches are in Europe, thirty in North America, two in Australia, one in Africa, and one in South America."
