CAMPERS: GET FIRE PERMITS

Must Follow Rules for Safety In Forests Before starting on a camping trip which may carry you into national forest areas, don't forget to obtain a campfire permit if you contemplate pitching your tent under the trees. This warning is broadcast by national forest officials through automobile clubs and other-organizations.

Permits are required for campfires, and for stoves burning gasoline, kerosene or wood, They are issued without charge and are good for, the entire year. Each person obtaining a permit must sign an agreement to abide by the following rules: Not to build fires on national forest lands closed to camping or the building of fires.

Not to smoke on forest lands closed to camping or the building of fires.

Not to smoke on forest lands closed to camping and his pecial posted snoking, except in camp, and places of habitation areas.
