## Flood Districts to Be Compiled

Cities thruout the county may be asked to furnish reports on areas inside their city limits that are subject to inundation in times of flood, as the result of a recommendation made to State Real Estate Commissioner J. Mortimer Clark today by Chief Engineer C. H. Howell of the flood control district.

Howell said his office would be glad to extend assistance to the state official in determining if proposed subdivisions are subject to any flood damage, as recently requested.

"It is impractical to outline all of the areas within the flood control district that are subject to these conditions except in certain outstanding cases such as the Nigger Slough area and the Del Ray Lagoon area at the mouth of Ballona Creek," Howell said. "It is practical, however, to study individual tracts as they are proposed for subdivision or sale and determine whether all or portions of the same are reasonably subject to either flood hazard or inundation."

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## Lomita Caretaker of Water Works Said Retained

New contracts for the employment of caretakers at Lomita and other county water works districts thruout the county were approved this week by the board of supervisors.

Among the caretakers whose employment contracts were renewed was J. H. Samuel of the Lomita county water works district.

Remuneration for the position of caretaker varies from \$80 to \$150 a month, depending upon the amount of work required, and the size of the district.

## San Fernando Valley Fiesta

The 17 communities in the San Fernando valley are sponsoring the seventh annual Fiesta and Pageant on behalf of the restoration of Mission San Fernando, June 18 and 19, according to the Touring Department of the National Automobile Club.
