Expansion of its refinery at Watson, near Torrance, by construction of two combination crude topping and eracking units to cost \$5,000,000, was announced this week by the Richfield Oil corporation. Work is to start immediately on the project which will require a year to complete.

Each unit will have a daily capacity of 30,000 barrels. The output of the refinery will be increased 25 percent. A polymerization plant will be installed with a daily capacity of 6,000,000 cubic feet of gas. This plant makes gases.
