The Torrance post office came within \$4,632 of fulfilling gross postal receipts for a first-class post office. Postmaster Earl Conner regretfully announced this week as he closed the books for fiscal 1936-37.

"I wish we could have transacted the \$44,000 minimum business that would have raised our status to first-class," he said.
