Wheat Brings Better Times to Panhandle

FORT WORTH, Tex., July 8 (U.P.)—Wheat from the Texas "dust bowl" is flowing to market in a golden tide, bringing good times again to a section that has known only drought and low prices in six years.

The "dust bowl" had its drought in 1936 and in early 1937, but rains came to much of the area to give it the best wheat crop since 1931. Approximately 27,000,000 bushels of wheat was raised in Texas this year and sold at a price between 90 cents and \$1 a bushel.

Local tradition holds that the Texas Panhandle is the place "where you can expect more wheat and raise less; and raise more wheat when you expect less, than any place in the world."

In "Cafe Metropole," in which she is costarred with Tyrone Power and Adolphe Menjou, Miss Young's supporting cast features Gregory Ratoff, Charles Winninger and Helen Westley.

Education Seen Near New Era

Education in 2000 has been forecast by Dr. David Snedden of Teachers College of Columbia University.

As a result of trends already in evidence and changes that will take place in the next 40 years or so he predicts among other things:

That all children of all people will continue their full-time education until at least 27 years old.

That every young adult will be specially trained and certified some time after 18 years of age for full competency of some specialized vocation.

That there will be an ever growing education for political citizenship or civic careers in view of the already wide expansions of state or political functions, provided, of course, the democratic methods still prevail.

Too Romantic Now
That during the school years between 10 and 20, increasing attention will be paid to superior utilization of the non-vocational and self-culture studies.

In the meantime, however, Dr. Snedden declared it is necessary for the United States to get rid of certain other tendencies, now manifest, the principal one of which is an excessive proportion among leaders and teachers who seem to be romanticists instead of realists.

"They philosophize too much," Dr. Snedden said. "Their alleged reasoning is excessively deductive. Their terminologies are too vague and equivocal."

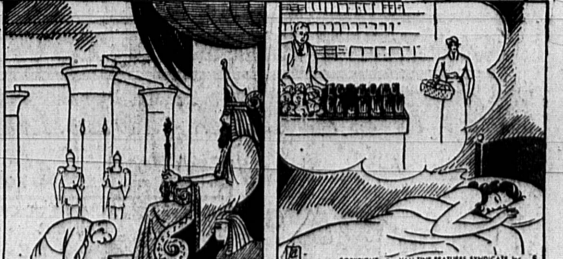
