**The FOOD PRIMER**

**C** stands for Cheese For Carrots and Cherries. For Chicken, Crab Apples And Choice Huckleberries.

Now that the preserving season is approaching, these "C" foods are in the limelight. Some women are planning to stock their emergency shelves with glass jars of cherries, chicken and crab apples. Others, who do not put up their own goodies each season, are purchasing supplies for next winter—feeling that prices are very likely to continue climbing.

When stocking your preserve closet, remember to purchase foods packed in containers of glass—or to use new glass containers if stocking with home-made delicacies. These jars are transparent—and through their sparkling sides you can see the quality of the foods. Food packers are constantly improving the shape and appearance of these glass containers, so that now, shelves of cheese, cherries and crab apples are exceedingly attractive.

If you would like to try some home-made goodies this season, here are a couple of easy-to-follow recipes:
