Logi ORDINANCE NO. 296

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE FIXING THE TAX RATES AND LEVYING TAXES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1937.

The City Council of the City of Torrance does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. That for the purpose of raising the sums of money necessary to be raised by taxation upon the tax able property of the City of Torrance as a revenue to carry on the various Departments of said City for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1937, the rates of taxes for the different portions of the City for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1937, in the number of cents upon each one hundred dollars of the assessed value of said property as assessed by the County Assessor and equalized by the Board of Sulpervisors of the County of Los Angeles, State of California, and for the several funds and purposes set forth in the following table, the taxes levied upon property in each portion of said City hereinafter described and designated by a district number being at the column headed by the district number, which is prefixed to the description of such portion of said city as hereinafter stated, DISTRICT NO. 1.
