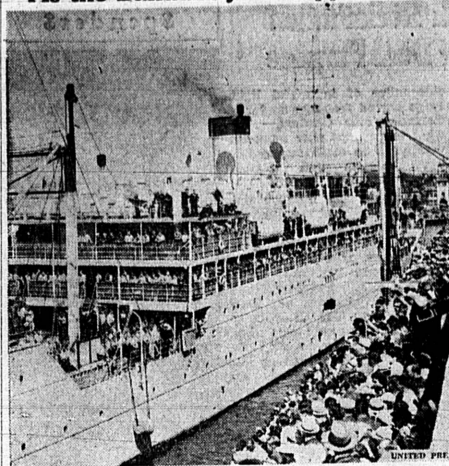

That property owners who saw at least 25 homes inundated by the overflow from the slough last spring are actively working for the drainage plan for adjoining Bixby Slough recently outlined by F. M. Andreani was revealed this week by Keystone chamber leaders.

Andreani's plan calls for an expenditure of WPA funds to drain Bixby Slough into West Basin of Los Angeles harbor, make suitable fills and reclaim present marshes for industrial sites.
